Meeting your MP

	As part of your letter you can ask to meet your MP at a surgery A surgery is a one-to-one meeting between an MP and a local person they represent. You don't have to meet your MP if you don't want to- just remember to remove that part of the letter.
	This is a good chance to tell your MP more about Good Lives and ask them to take action
Meeting	Each MP holds surgeries in a different way so you need to check how your MP does it. Sometimes you need to book an appointment. Sometimes you can just drop in.
