# Who led the review

## A Leadership Group

## How the Board will work to do its job

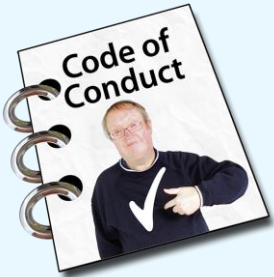


3 main ways the Board will work

2. Make sure the Board plans its work and checks what has happened and how the Partnership Board made a difference each year

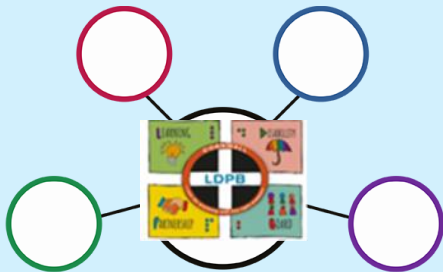


# The recommendations

7 big recommendations to make the Partnership Board stronger

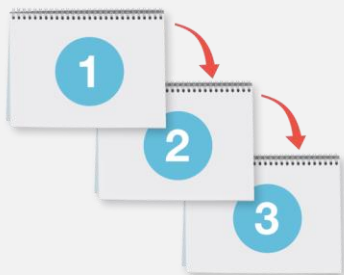


6. Recruit Co Chairs who will lead the Board
