

There are 3 main ways it does this

- Supporting positive change being led by its members and partners

What the Board is here to do





The Board links to Big Plans and decisions through the Integrated Care Board The lead on the Board is part of the Partnership Board

The Partnership Board helps the Integrated Care Board make positive change by

- Giving the Board a direct link to people with learning disabilities and their families
- Getting evidence on how services are working
- Making sure they know what matters to people with learning disabilities and their families



To make sure that people with learning disabilities lead the work of the Board

- There will be support for local groups or networks to feed into the board and be part of the work
- There will be support for people to take on leadership roles
- All the work will be easy to understand and make everyone feel included
- There will be champions for topics where disabled and non disabled people work together



To make a difference the Partnership Board will focus its work


It will do this by everyone sharing what they think is important

Who leads on Transport?


Can the Carbon Neutral Challenge be a way of helping public transport get better ?
